AFSCME Council 5 Mourns the Death of George Floyd

AFSCME Council 5 honors the life of George Floyd and extends our deepest condolences and solidarity to the family and loved ones of George Floyd.

"The killing of George Floyd was a shocking and heinous act of violence that demands accountability, transparency, and justice," said AFSCME President Lee Saunders. "As a union that represents several thousand law enforcement officers and has long been in the vanguard of the struggle for civil rights, AFSCME believes we cannot be forced to choose between racial justice and effective policing. A free and healthy society can and must have both."

"The murder of George Floyd is an absolute tragedy and should never have happened," said Council 5 Executive Director Julie Bleyhl. "We must stand together with all of our neighbors and reject discrimination, hate, and prejudice in all its forms."

This week, thousands of Minnesotans - including many AFSCME members - have marched to demand justice. We also learned that white supremacist groups across the nation are activating

to hide among peaceful protesters and create havoc in our communities.

Inclusion, equity, fairness, morality, and justice for all are values we must always fight for. People advocating otherwise have a clear goal of fomenting hate, violence, fear, and destruction.

In this time of international upheaval, we must not become divided or lose sight of our ultimate goal: justice.

We must protect each other and rebuild. Together, we will build an inclusive world and see the changes and reforms made that our communities need.

POCI Caucus intend to make police and criminal justice reform a top priority of the likely June special session and into the future.

Legislative action under discussion includes:

- Reform the investigation and prosecution of officer-involved deaths and wrongful actions
- Increase police accountability and transparency
- Raise standards of conduct and support officer excellence
- Partner officers with the communities they serve
- Repair and build community trust and create community-centered public safety
