New Officials Sworn In

The 116th Congress was gaveled in last Thursday, giving Democrats control of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Governor Tim Walz and Lt. Governor Peggy Flanagan, alongside several other AFSCMEendorsed Constitutional Officers, were sworn in on Monday, kicking off a week of inaugural events and celebrations.

The 2019 Minnesota legislative session begins Tuesday, January 8, and we couldn't be more excited! The new slate of State Representatives, which we successfully flipped to a Democratic majority, includes Local 2938 members Kelly Moller (District 42A) Zack Stephenson (District 36A). Dozens more AFSCME-endorsed candidates who are committed to fighting for working people across the state also begin their terms Tuesday.

Congratulations to all! We can't wait to see the great things we accomplish together for working Minnesotans this session.

- Members of Local 3558 participated in multiple holiday giving projects. At the Duluth YWCA, members collected supplies for the Young Moms Program, a transitional housing program that helps young moms and their kids build secure lives. At the Head of the Lakes United Way, members planned and hosted the AFL-CIO Community Services' annual kid's holiday party, where union families decorated cookies, met Santa, and received holiday meal baskets and gifts.
- Local 3800, University of Minnesota Clerical Workers, held a toy drive for the U of M Masonic Children's Hospital. In addition to collecting toys in the weeks leading up to the holidays, local leaders held union coffee breaks at multiple campuses to collect toys and organize members. Legislative Session Begins

The 2019 legislative session begins Tuesday, Jan. 8 with the mission to set the state's biennial budget. With a \$1.5 billion projected surplus, expectations are high. AFSCME Council 5 enters the session with a positive outlook.

The need for 327 Corrections Officers and increased staffing levels for state, county and higher education programs and services will require all hands on deck throughout the session.

Gov. Walz and Lt. Gov. Peggy Flanagan have outlined a One Minnesota road map, tapping Sen. Tony Lourey, a leading supporter of maintaining the provider tax, to serve as the new Department of Health Commissioner.

Gov. Walz has also advocated for a gas tax increase and comprehensive transportation funding, both of which we will continue to support.

Council 5 continues to work with our coalition partners on enhancing and expanding paid family leave and sick and safe time, and will continue to advocate for inclusion of domestic violence in safety leave.

We will keep supporting funding for the Public Employee Relations Board (PERB), protecting the Public Employee Labor Relations Act (PELRA) and opposing attacks on our defined benefit pensions. With a DFL-controlled House and Governor's office and a Republican- controlled Senate, it is incumbent on all of us to do our part to achieve our goals. We look forward to working with AFSCME members from across the state to assure a positive and productive 2019 legislative session.

Special Election February 5

Our longtime champion, Sen. Tony Lourey (Senate District 11 of Carlton, Pine and Kanabec Counties), has been appointed to join the Walz Administration as the new Commissioner of the Department of Human Services. This is excellent news. The Special Election to fill the vacant Senate seat will take place on **Feb. 5**.

We'll screen candidates on Saturday, **Jan. 12** at the Cloquet Labor Temple. Anyone who is a member and a PEOPLE contributor may participate in the candidate screening. Members will have an opportunity to join PEOPLE at the screening.

Watch your email and our website for an endorsement announcement following the PEOPLE screening. Then, mark your calendar to vote in the Primary on **Tuesday**, **Jan. 22** and in the General Special Election on **Tuesday**, **Feb. 5**.

Republicans currently have a oneseat majority in the Minnesota Senate, so it's extremely important that we elect a strong AFSCME champion to continue representing us in the district.
