### Legislative Session Wraps Up

This year's State Legislative session - including a one-day special session - concluded in the wee hours of Saturday, May 25. Through the hard work of AFSCME members, labor siblings, and activists across the state, we secured some major wins for working families:

- Made wage theft a felony in MN
- Protected the provider tax
- Expanded the Working Families Tax Credit
- Funded 78 new corrections officer positions
- Invested \$30 million per year in Local Government Aid (LGA) and County Program Aid (CPA)
- Boosted MFIP for the first time in 33 years, supporting working families across the state
- Funded 4,000 more spots for voluntary pre-kindergarten programs across the state
- Held pharmaceutical companies accountable for the opioid crisis by charging them a fee that will be used for addiction prevention, intervention and treatment
- · Fought off cuts to public schools
- Avoided a government shutdown

But we have a lot of work left to do to pass Paid Family and Medical Leave, defend the 40 hour work week, hiring enough staff to deliver the public services Minnesotans deserve, and fund critical transportation projects in the years to come. The fight isn't over - we're just getting started.
