Radio Control Operators Ratify Contract

AFSCME Local 3142 Unit 25 Radio Control Operators (RCOs) from Roseville and Rochester State Patrol ratified their tentative agreement for the Unit 25 contract for 7/1/19through 6/30/2021 at voting sites on August 19-20. This TA covers 2.25% increase across the board for 7/1/19and 2.5% for 7/1/20, improved language for when employees pick up OT on their regularly schedule day off and then could be mandated to work additional OT hours, improved language for sick leave for parent/step-parent, gender inclusive language throughout the contract, increase of comp bank liquidation carryover maximum from 50 to 80 hours, and new paid leave for transitions as a result of non-certification, improved benefits for dental and orthodontia and new vision benefit to begin in 2021.

Frances Perkins was known for breaking barriers. As Franklin D. Roosevelt's Secretary of Labor, Perkins was the first woman to sit on a Presidential Cabinet. She was the main architect of the Social Security system, the Fair Labor Standards Act, and even the first overtime and minimum wage laws in the United States. Perkins was a tireless advocate for workers' rights, pushing to establish child labor laws, unemployment and pension benefits, and even helping to define the standard 40-hour workweek.
