We reached an incredible Tentative Agreement on insurance at 6:10 AM on Friday, June 27th.

The State came to the table with proposals that would have **added THOUSANDS of dollars in ADDITIONAL costs every single year**. We're talking **skyrocketing deductibles, inflated copays, outrageous max-out-of-pocket limits, prescription drug costs, and more**. But <u>none</u> of this is happening — **because we fought back and we won!** That is the power of being in a union!

To be clear... Thanks to the strength of our bargaining team and the collective power of our union members, **those harmful plan design changes are OFF THE TABLE**. That means you keep the coverage you've earned—without being gouged at every turn.

👉 What We Protected:

We preserved the structure of your current health plan—no new deductibles, no jacked-up copays, no drastic increases in your maximum out-of-pocket. <u>That's real money saved and a huge victory for all public employees.</u>

Final premium rates are not yet confirmed, and we will continue to monitor and update you when we have more certainty. But this deal saves you **THOUSANDS** of dollars every year and **WE FOUGHT OFF** premium design shifts - a major win!
