This is a political year, but our values are not partisan. Vote for the candidate who shares your values and will put you and your work front-and-center during debates, discussions, and policy-making.

Get the facts regarding voting rights in our state:

- Your employer must pay you for the time you need to vote, if it falls within your scheduled work time. Your employer cannot require you to use personal leave or vacation time (see Minnesota Statutes [204C.04](#) and [204C.08 subd. 1d](#)). - If your voter registration is current and active, you do not need to bring identification to vote. If you need to register or update your registration, or you have not voted in four years or more, you will need to show [proof of residence](#) before you cast your vote.
